



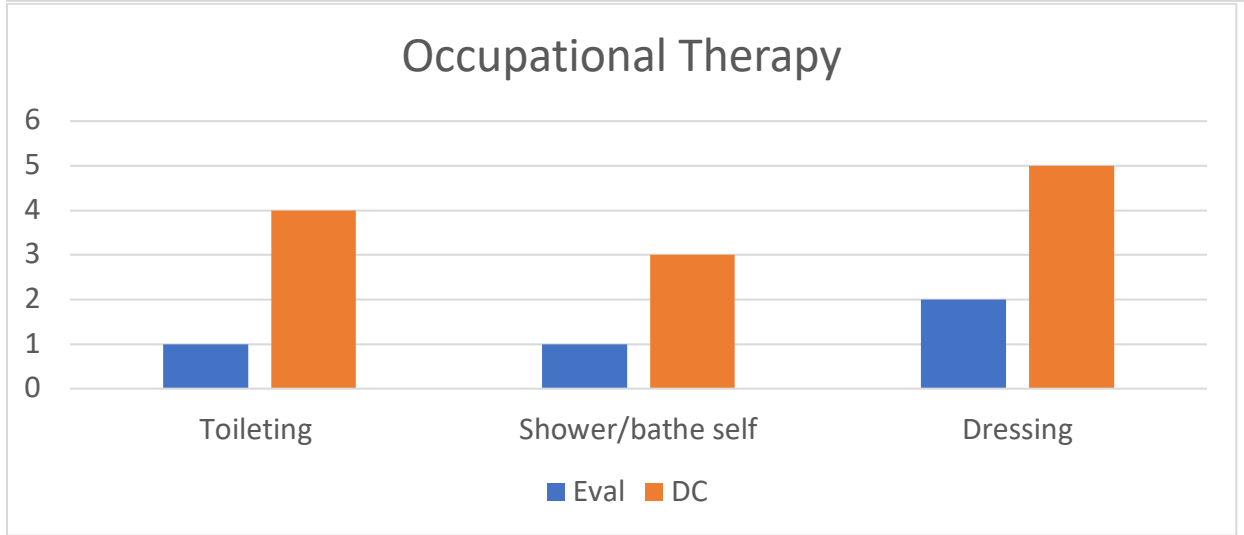
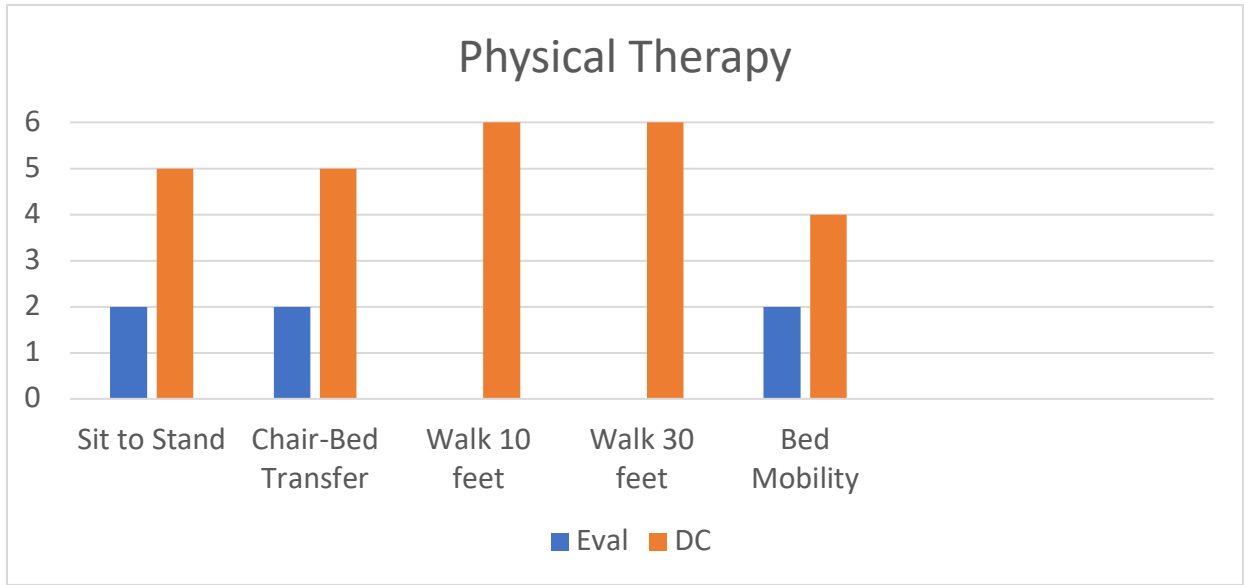
OUTCOMES MATTER



Bonnie Sutton is a 101-year-old female who presented to St. Lukes the Vintage on 6/21/2024 for new onset atrial fibrillation possibly due to GI bleeding and anemia. She was treated for these conditions with positive results and then discharged to Park Manor CyFair for post-acute skilled Nursing and Rehab services on 7/2/2024.

Mrs. Sutton was evaluated by Physical, Occupational and Speech therapy services and the initial assessments indicated that Mrs. Sutton requires Maximum assistance for bathing, Total assistance for toileting, Minimum assistance for UB dressing, Total assistance for LB dressing, Moderate assistance for bed mobility, Moderate assistance for transfers, and able to walk 5ft with a RW with Min A.

Physical, Occupational, and Speech therapy services created plans of care that were individualized for Mrs. Sutton and following 18 days of skilled physical rehabilitation, she demonstrated significant improvements in her functional mobility and ability to perform her activities of daily living. She increased her bathing and toileting to Moderate assistance, UB dressing to Stand by Assistance, LB dressing to Moderate assistance, bed mobility and transfers to Contact Guard Assistance and able to ambulate with a RW 30ft with Contact Guard Assistance. Mrs. Sutton was successfully discharged home with home health therapy.



MDS Section GG Functional Scores	
06 - Independent	Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper
05 - Setup or clean-up assistance	Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.
04 - Supervision or touching assistance	Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.
03 - Partial/moderate assistance	Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs, but provides less than half the effort.
02 - Substantial/maximal assistance	Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort.
01 - Dependent	Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to

complete the activity. Or the assistance of 2 or more helpers is required for the patient to complete the activity.
