



## OUTCOMES MATTER



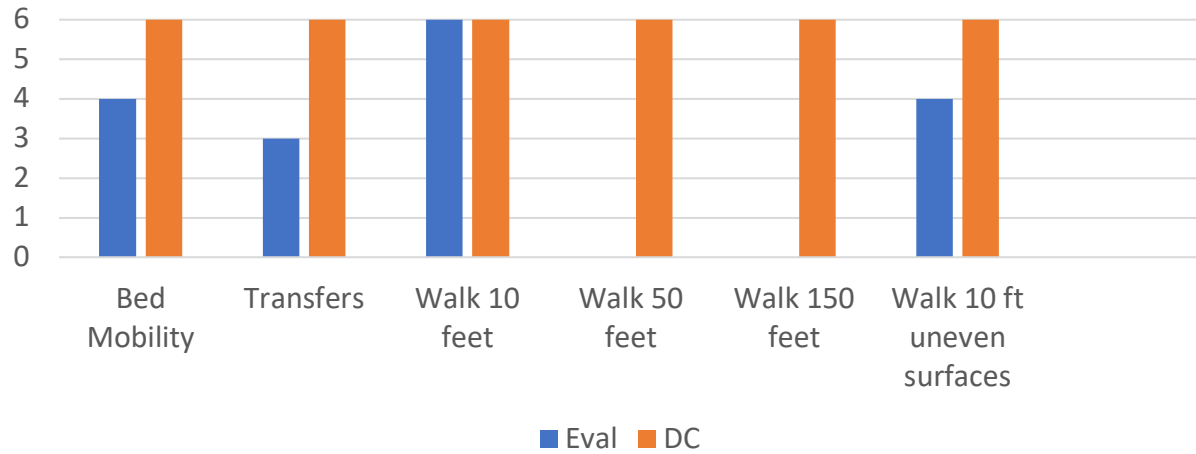
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Mrs. Mary Brejcha is a 79-year-old who admitted to Park Manor CyFair on February 23<sup>rd</sup> following a hospital stay at St. Lukes Medical Center. She was diagnosed with Malignant Neoplasm of Pancreas. Mrs. Brejcha was evaluated by Physical and Occupational therapy and screened by Speech therapy services. The Initial assessments indicated that she was Mod A with bathing, Mod A for toileting, Set-up for UB dressing and Min A for LB dressing. She was Mod I with bed mobility, Min A for transfers and ambulating 10ft with RW with Min A. Skilled therapy services are warranted to access functional abilities, increase functional activity tolerance, increase independence with gait and improve ADL function to return home with increased mobility and independence with self-care task.

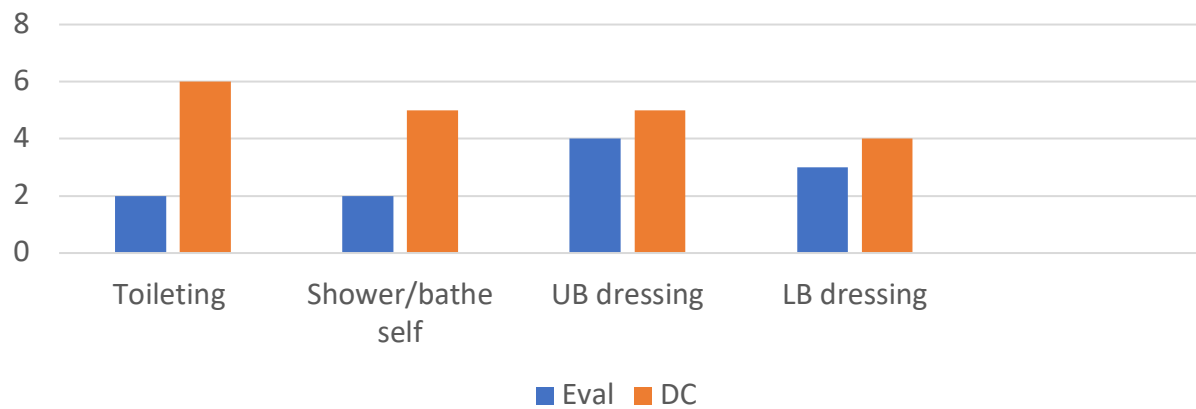
Physical and Occupational therapy created plans of care that were individualized for Mrs. Brejcha and following 23 days of skilled rehabilitation she was able to safely return home with increase functional mobility.

Mrs. Brejcha increased her bathing to Supervision, toileting with Modified Independence, UB dressing with Modified Independence and LB dressing with Supervision. She increased bed mobility to Modified Independence, transfers to Supervision, and she is ambulating with a RW 150ft with Supervision. Mrs. Brejcha worked extremely hard and pushed herself with the help of the rehab department to achieve her goal of returning home. We are super proud of you Mrs. Brejcha.

### MDS Section GG Functional Scores

**06 - Independent**

Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper

**05 - Setup or clean-up assistance**

Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.

**04 - Supervision or touching assistance**

Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.

**03 - Partial/moderate assistance**

Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs, but provides less than half the effort.

**02 - Substantial/maximal assistance**

Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort.

**01 - Dependent**

Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or the assistance of 2 or more helpers is required

for the patient to complete the activity.
